He speaks publicly and demonstrates excellent qualities as a public speaker and he would well represent the Chapel Program and the Institution in the local community. I personally recommend this custody reduction without reservation based on knowing Charles coupled with his documented stability and good behavior.

Since that time he has progressed to the top of the scale from usher, Deacon, Student Chaplain, and now after four years, Associate Pastor, preaching and teaching in the Protestant Chapel directly under myself. Also, he is the Yokefellow Spiritual group therapy Director of five groups with 60 men and 5 outside local sponsors. Mr. Watson's record of good time speaks loudly for itself. Due to all that Mr. Watson has accomplished over the years in studies, hard work, and group therapy, I believe it is time to consider him for Minimum custody for none other reason than to give credit where credit is due. I believe there has been enough time to evaluate Mr. Watson and I stand with him without any hesitation.

Mr. Watson heads out our Worship department, Student Chaplain Program, Yokefellow Group Therapy, and works with Administration. He is responsible for security of the Chapel and works closely with custody. Our Chapel is totally inmate ran with the exception of myself and supervisors who stand in during my absence. Over the last year the attendance and operation of the Chapel has doubled and this is believed to be due to men like Mr. Watson who pick up responsibility and become responsible men that I can trust. Mr. Watson has many future goals of working with inmates in an even greater degree, developing a kids ministry using his life as an example and testimony, and letting his present life minister to the general public. I believe in the efforts of Mr. Watson and support his goals and reccomend him highly. The latest in the life of Mr. Watson is his marriage. My only regret was that I was called away on personal family matters and could not preform the ceremony. My only request of the board is that they give Mr. Watson every possible opportunity, always keeping a positive outlook on his present life and future.

I have personally seen him develop a balance of theology with excellent spiritual growth. He has handled direction and assigned work well. He has been conscientious in his 6 hours daily assigned as Teacher's Aide. Most days, he works 2 additional hours in ministry training.
