Watson was assigned to the Facility-B Lifer Treatment Offender Program (LTOP), and completed the Cognitive Behavioral, and the Substance Use Disorder Treatment Program. Watson is very serious about his rehabilitation and his performance in the LTOP Program is commendable as he maintained excellent attendance records. Watson is respectful to Facility-B mentors, SUDT staff, and the inmates on Facility B. Watson is a soft spoken gentleman who is cheerful and gracious. I have spoken to Watson concerning his commitment offense, which was a high notoriety case. Watson has expressed great remorse, shame and guilt for his crimes he committed as a member of the Manson Cult. Watson is clearly a repentant, and a changed person who values life. Additionally, Watson does not identify with a criminal mind, on the contrary he is very dedicated to his Christian Ministry. As a former police officer and a CDCR

Correctional Officer with over 24 years of service, I have the strong opinion that Watson appears to be suitable for parole. This is not an easy statement for me to publicize as I do not take the idea of paroling people lightly, as our society deserves the very best that CDCR can parole. Watson has served nearly 50 years for his commitment offenses, subsequently, I submit this Letter of Support with great respect to the victims of the Manson Cult crimes.
